God is completely righteous; He is utterly without sin. We are completely unrighteous; we are depraved and full of sin. But God has shown mercy and grace toward us. He has provided a way for us to have forgiveness from sin, and a relationship with Him. To illustrate this principle to your family, act out a court scene. Choose one family member to be the judge, another to be the prosecutor, and another to be the guilty person. Allow the prosecutor to explain to the judge why the prisoner is guilty. After he or she has done so, allow the judge to pardon the guilty person. Just as the judge pardoned the guilty person when he or she did not deserve it, God in all His righteousness has pardoned us.

As winter drags on, snow removal around your home will be necessary. Please keep the following

tips in mind while shoveling:

- Wear sturdy shoes with rugged soles to help prevent slips and falls.
- Never smoke while shoveling. Tobacco smoke constricts blood vessels just as cold air does; the combination could be dangerous.
- If you become short of breath while shoveling, stop and rest. If you feel pain or tightness in your chest, become dizzy, faint or start sweating heavily, stop immediately and call for help.
- Take turns with a friend or family member while shoveling.
