What is your child learning?

During Sunday school, our Junior and Teen classes use the D6 curriculum from Randall House. Unfortunately, we have learned that many people rely on our pastor, Sunday school teachers, or youth pastor to be the primary spiritual influence for our kids. The problem is we only spend, at most, 4 hours each week at church. What about the other 164 hours?

D6 stands for Deuteronomy 6:5-7 which commands dads and moms to take everyday opportunities to impress God's Word upon the hearts of their children. D6 is foundational to raising spiritual champions for Christ. We must be active in passing our faith along to our kids. It's clear from D6 that, while church is a vital part of this development, it cannot stop there. It must continue in the home.
