
Spring Cleaning

Daylight Saving Time Begins

On Sunday, March 9, (**NEXT WEEK-END**) at 2am, Daylight Saving Time begins. Please remember to set your clocks forward 1 hour on Saturday night, March 8.



The phrase "Spring forward, Fall back" helps people remember how Daylight Saving Time affects their clocks. At 2am on the second Sunday in March, we set our clocks forward one hour ahead of Standard Time. We "Fall back" at 2am on the first Sunday in November by setting our clock back one hour and thus returning to Standard Time.

Daylight Saving Time was instituted in the US during World War I to save energy for war production by taking advantage of the later hours of daylight between April and October. During World War II the federal government again required the states to observe the time change. Between the wars and after World War II, states and communities chose whether or not to observe Daylight Saving Time.
