**Feet Washing Service**

Please join next Sunday for communion and foot washing. During the morning worship service we will have communion. During the evening service we will have the foot washing. As we observe this sacred ordinance, which teaches humility and reminds the believer of the necessity of daily cleansing from all sin.

It was instituted by the Lord Jesus Christ, and called an "example" on the night of His betrayal. It is the duty and happy prerogative of every believer to observe this sacred ordinance. Every Christian denomination has distinctive beliefs and practices that serve to give it identity and define its heritage. Individually, these are not necessarily unique to the movement; together they form a pattern of defining characteristics. For Free Will Baptists, this heritage includes the practice of three ordinances: Baptism, the Lord's Supper, and Washing the Saints' Feet.

The word ordinance is significant. Such practices were traditionally called sacraments, implying "means of grace." Roman Catholicism recognized seven sacraments. Martin Luther reduced the number to two, Baptism and the Eucharist; many Protestant groups followed suit. Ulrich Zwingli, resisting the idea that these are means of saving grace, defined them as symbolic, benefiting believers by providing graphic reminders of the truths they represent. Baptists and many other Christians follow Zwingli and speak of these as ordinances, practices ordained by the Lord Jesus for continuing observance in His church.

Free Will Baptists are not the only ones to regard Feet washing as an ordinance. We believe that it is firmly grounded in the New Testament and well attested in the history of the church.
