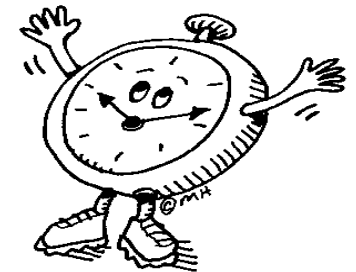

**Daylight Saving Time Ends**

On Sunday, November 6, at 2am, Daylight Saving Time ends. Please remember to set back your clocks back 1 hour on Saturday night, November 5. Our Sunday evening service will start at 6pm beginning Sunday, November 6. The phrase "Spring forward, Fall back" helps people remember how Daylight Saving Time affects their clocks. At 2am on the second Sunday in March, we set our clocks forward one hour ahead of Standard Time. We "Fall back" at 2am on the first Sunday in November by set-



ting our clock back one hour and thus returning to Standard Time.

Daylight Saving Time was instituted in the US during World War I to save energy for war production by taking advantage of the later hours of daylight between April and October. During World War II the federal government again required the states to observe the time change. Between the wars and after World War II, states and communities chose whether or not to observe Daylight Saving Time.
